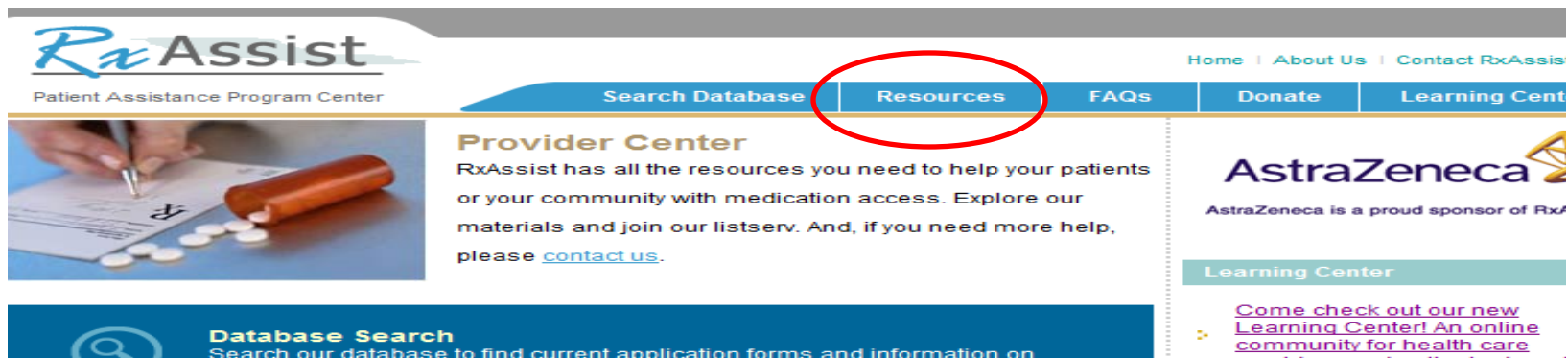

On your own, go back and check out Caring Connection. It's free.

Final note: The applications on the RX Assist web site are directly tied to the pharmaceutical company. They will be the latest version of the application. It is important to print applications one at a time on an as needed basis because of these updates. Most pharmaceutical companies will base their assistance on the Federal Poverty Level. You will find the most recent Federal Poverty Levels under the **Resource Tab** of the Rx Assist Web page.



The secret to assisting an individual in finding prescription drugs is to never give up. Many manufacturers will have a different program on their web site. If someone is prescribed a drug that is not on the formulary try the web site and if you do not find anything call them.

Last but never least, this manual is designed to give you the basics only. It is important to explore the Medicare and Rx Assist web site. The more you learn the better you will be a serving consumers.
