## Protected Income Level

On May 8, 2021 the Kansas Legislature passed a budget that included an appropriation of funds to be used for an increase to the Protected Income Level (PIL) for Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Medicaid waivers.

The PIL is the amount of monthly income protected from medical expenses to allow consumers to meet their needs. Currently, the PIL is \$1,157 per month. This means that if a consumer receives the HCBS waivers, any income over this amount must be paid to the State of Kansas. This is referred to as a "client obligation."

In the budget for fiscal year 2021 that has passed, the PIL will increase from \$1,157 a month to \$2,383 a month which is 300% of federal Supplemental Security Income. We have been informed that the change will go into effect on July 1, 2021 and that consumers who currently have a client obligation will be receiving official notice from the State of Kansas and/or their Managed Care Organization regarding their client obligation.

## Attention Youth In Lyon County!

Resource Center for Independent Living, Inc. (RCIL) is inviting you to join Youth Transition Club! This group is for youth and young adults ages (14-24) with disabilities in Lyon County. In this group you will have the opportunity to learn independent living skills such as cooking, cleaning, budgeting, and

employment skills. Youth Transition Club meets on the last Monday

of each month (except on holidays) at 5:00 p.m. Although we've been doing all meetings virtual via Zoom, we are trying to start transitioning back to in person meetings. For the month of July we are giving the option to do it in person or via

Zoom.

Youth Transition Club is organized and led by Crystal Barbary, RCIL's Youth Transition Specialist. This is a free event for youth ages 14-24 with disabilities and their families. Upcoming dates for Youth Transition Club are July 26th, Au-

## Freedom!

RCIL Independent Living Specialist (ILS), Macy Collins, assisted Charla in obtaining a power chair carrier for her vehicle. She had a carrier at one time, but it was stolen off her car. Macy taught her the different funding organizations and resources available, how to request use of her assistive technology funds through her Managed Care Organization (MCO), and how to explain the third party funding reimbursement process to vendors. Macy assisted Charla with completing funding applications with Cerebral Palsy Research Foundation and

Friends of Man. She was awarded \$1,700 of the \$2,800 needed. Macy then encouraged Charla to advocate with her MCO. Macy also taught her about the \$7,500 in funds a person on the

Home and Community Based Services Physical Disability waiver can use for assistive technology, so she would have the information going into the conversation with MCO. Charla, with support and encouragement from Macy, called her MCO multiple times to show the seriousness of the need in her life. The MCO finally agreed to cover the rest of the cost. Charla stated that she learned getting funding help is a lot of paperwork, but that she knows more about getting things funded and how to speak up for her needs. She also now knows

vendors such as Kansas Truck Mobility whom worked with her in the Wichita area. Finally, she stated that she will now be able to go shopping and to her daughter's events. She added "I'll just be able to get out! Freedom!"

## SPIL Employment Workgroup Update

The Statewide Plan for Independent Living Plan (SPIL) Employment workgroup would like to invite you to their next workgroup meeting. The group welcomes anyone who is curious about getting a job, anyone actively seeking employment, and all who would like to increase employment opportunities for Kansans with disabilities.

The group is currently learning about employment resources such as Vocational Rehabilitation, Working Healthy, and Social Security work incentives. Many of these resources allow people with disabilities to work AND keep the benefits they need such as Medicaid. The



group is now meeting every other month to hear from experts on these and other topics. The next meeting will be held via phone and Zoom on July 13th at 2:00pm.

Many of the group members are also planning and preparing for 2021 Disability Mentoring Day (DMD). DMD is a national event that provides persons with disabilities an employment experience. All DMD events are unique to local communities. A consumer might be able to job shadow their dream job, they may get training to learn job skills, or perhaps tour a local business. #### You can use this application to:

- · register to vote in Kansas
- change your name, address, or affiliation with a political party

#### To register to vote, you must:

- be a U.S. citizen and a resident of the state of Kansas.
- have reached the age of 18 years before the next election
- have received final discharge from imprisonment, parole, or conditional release if convicted of a felony.
- have abandoned your former residence and/or name.

#### How to register to vote:

Return your completed application to your county.
 Addresses are on the back of this application. Your county election officer will mail you a notice when your application has been processed.

- Voter registration closes 21 days before any election.
   In order to be eligible to vote in that election, your application must be postmarked on or before that date.
- If you decline to register to vote, that fact will remain confidential and will be used for voter registration purposes only. If you do register to vote, the office where you apply will be kept confidential and will be used for voter registration purposes only.
- If this form is incomplete, it may be rejected.

#### Identification number requirements

Enter your current Kansas driver's license number or nondriver's identification card number. If you do not have either one, enter the last four digits of your Social Security number. If you do not have any of these numbers, write "none" in the box. The number will be used for administrative purposes only and will not be disclosed to the public. K.S.A. 25-2309

## You Asked for It

## How can I participate in Kansas elections?

To participate in Kansas elections, you must register to vote and then complete your ballot on election day.

To register to vote you will need to complete the Kansas Voter Registration Application form. A copy of the form is in this newsletter. You can complete the form and mail it to your local county courthouse. There is a list of all of the county courthouse addresses in Kansas on the back of the form.

If you are already registered to vote but you had a name change, or moved to a different address, or wanted to change your party affiliation for voting you must complete the Kansas Voter Registration Application form in order to vote at the next election.

If you need help completing the Kansas Voter Registration Application form, feel free to contact your local RCIL office and someone will assist you.
